Myers was one of the founders of The U.S. Junior Chamber of Commerce in St. Louis. He was associated with Henry Giessenbier, Andy Mungenast, George Wilson and others of that period of Jaycee history. Myers was chairman of the national constitution committee and chairman of the midwest membership committee. He helped found the Dayton, Cincinnati, Columbus and Springfield Jaycees.

A long-time member of the Crew, Myers *"was always proud of his part in helping to establish the Jaycees and of the accomplishments of the organization,"* reports Leland. Myers served as reporter and editor during his newspaper career. He also served as chief of the Illinois Development Council and Assistant Director of the Illinois Wartime Office of Price Administration. He was an honorary lifetime member of the Springfield Jaycees.
